

Solid watercolour

All pigments are suitable for this most basic type of painting which dates from the 11th century.

Dosage :

1 part of gum Arabic 2 part of water 1.5 parts of pigment Glycerine, vinegar, honey

Preparation :

20 minutes + drying time

- 1. Add the water and gum together and heat the mixture to create a gummy liquid
- 2. Carefully mix the gummy liquid and the pigment with a spatula
- 3. Add the honey (a little), glycerine (drops) and vinegar (drops)
- 4. Create a fine, homogenous mix
- 5. Fill a bowl or other small receptacle where the mix can be left to dry for several days.

And there you have it - solid watercolour, natural and ready to use, all for a few euros
